General Policies and Expectations

ADVERTISING

- Permits must be obtained and approved by the Residence Life Office, Room 111, Palmer Center for all printed media (posters, fliers, T-shirts, etc.).
- Student organizations, businesses and individuals may advertise events and/or products on designated residence hall bulletin boards or locations for student pick up.

Advertising must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Avoid the use of obscene language.
- Be sensitive to social concerns such as sexism, racism, homophobia, and not use offensive language or illustrations.
- Advertisements may not include references to alcoholic beverages or other drugs.
- You must contact each hall desk to have your advertisements initialed, and receive instructions as to where advertisements may be posted.
- Advertisements that do not follow the above guidelines or are posted in non-designated areas will be taken down and discarded.

ALCOHOL POLICY

The priority in the residence halls is to provide an environment in which students may study and sleep. Social activities are encouraged and supported but take second priority to the rights of students to live in an atmosphere that supports their academic progress and personal well being.

The possession or use of fermented malt beverages, intoxicating liquors, and illegal drugs is not permitted in any of the residence halls.

- Decorative display and/or collection of empty alcoholic beverage containers is prohibited in residence hall rooms.
- Residents are responsible for the actions and behaviors of their guests as they relate to the use/misuse of alcohol.
- See the section for [legal](#) sanctions related to alcohol use.

BLOOD BORNE PATHOGENS

Due to the serious nature of blood borne pathogens, students finding blood, vomit, or other bodily fluids in bathrooms, residence hall rooms, or common areas should report it immediately to residence hall staff. Students responsible for these incidents are required to clean the affected location. Staff will provide disinfectant and instructions for safe decontamination of the area.
