Thank you for speaking with me about resolution of this matter.

The University is withdrawing the charge under the Campus Conduct Code set forth in my letter dated August 10, 2020.

We will schedule a mediation to address the concerns that were the basis of the charge regarding your Facebook post that was forwarded to your doctoral faculty on July 1, 2020. I will contact you shortly to schedule the date, time and location for the mediation.

If you wish to continue your doctoral program, then you should contact Heather Medina, the Interim Director of Admissions, who will provide guidance on the process to rescind your recent withdrawal. In addition, John Smith, the Director of Academic Operations, can provide guidance if you wish to complete the summer course from which you withdrew on July 18, 2020.

Thank you for sharing your concerns and suggestions about the Campus Hearing Board process. I forwarded the information to the Vice President for Student Affairs. In the meantime, please know that the University remains committed to providing an environment that permits and protects freedom of expression. This commitment is set forth in Policy I-55 – Campus Conduct Code.
